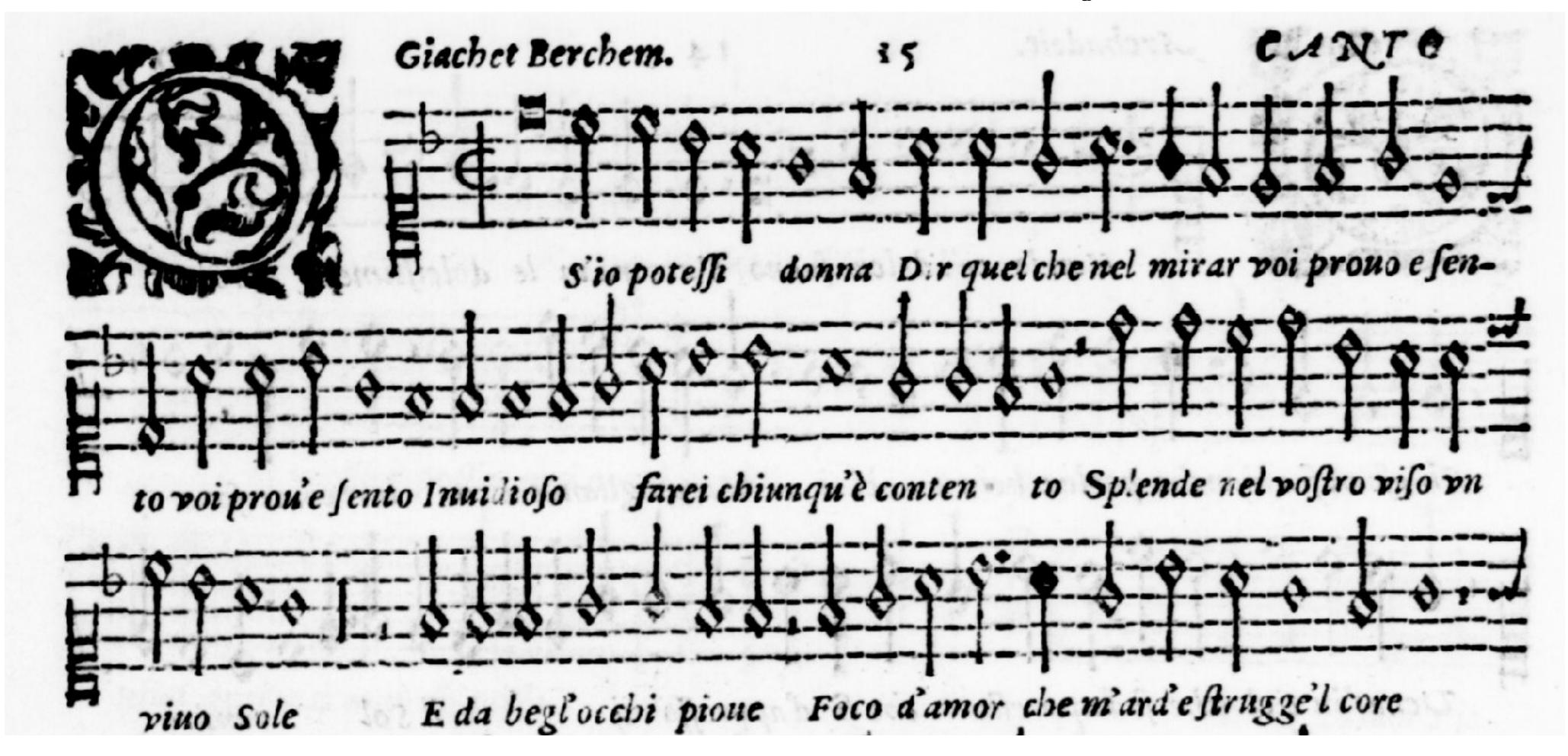

#### **Formats**

- ECOLM uses TabCode
  - (Which no-one else uses)
- e-Laute will use MEI
  - (Which has no tools yet, and isn't currently valid)

#### Sustainability

- ECOLM is implemented as:
  - A bespoke MySQL database schema
  - A hand-built PHP web application (from 2004)

#### **Formats**

- Each corpus uses different encoding formats, related to software platforms
- Metadata is different in each case, and no corpus uses authority records

#### Sustainability

- Serge Gerbode's corpus is a self-published website
- Steuer & Lutz's catalogue site was maintained by Marcus Lutz
- John Robinson's corpus was only published in paper form

# Part 3: Looking forwards

#### **Formats**

- Tablature encoding formats are often quite simple
- Conversion is possible
- LuteConv (Paul Overell, with Luke Emmett) converts between 13 formats

#### Sustainability I

- John Robinson's editions are now on a public GitHub repository, including MEI conversions
- We will do the same with the other collections

#### **Sustainability II**

- Without understanding what music these are editions of, how can we use them?
- How can we compare this with vocal music, without consistent metadata?
- Without some sort of navigation system, how can we find them?
- How do we add structure while remaining open to community contributions?
