"Nicht **heitere** Lust..".

The "h" of "heitere" is released as a deflated sigh. Warm air, drawn up from the sternum, is passed over the base of the throat with an almost **wheezing** quality.

"Hei-" is dulled by a straightening of the tone and obfuscation of any spinning quality.

As the *gravitation pull* of the minor tonic takes hold, "-<u>tere</u>" sink downwards, with an similarly dulled timbre.

"du weckest Düstere Wehmuth!"

"<u>du weckest</u>" is sung with a tenuto on each syllable, as if an especial effort is needed to speak the words.

I dig down into the chest colours. The vowels of "W<u>e</u>ck<u>e</u>st" and "D<u>ü</u>st-" are modified to reflect their **darker** companion ("**Er**" and "**u**" accordingly).

The rising minor third of "<u>dü–</u>" is **smeared** upwards, as if both notes were on the level of the lower pitch, not rising as all.

The semitone melisma of "**Weh**-muth" vowel is articulated with a heavy aspiration,

fostering a clunky, **woeful** quality.
