Built in Turku, Finland at STX Europe

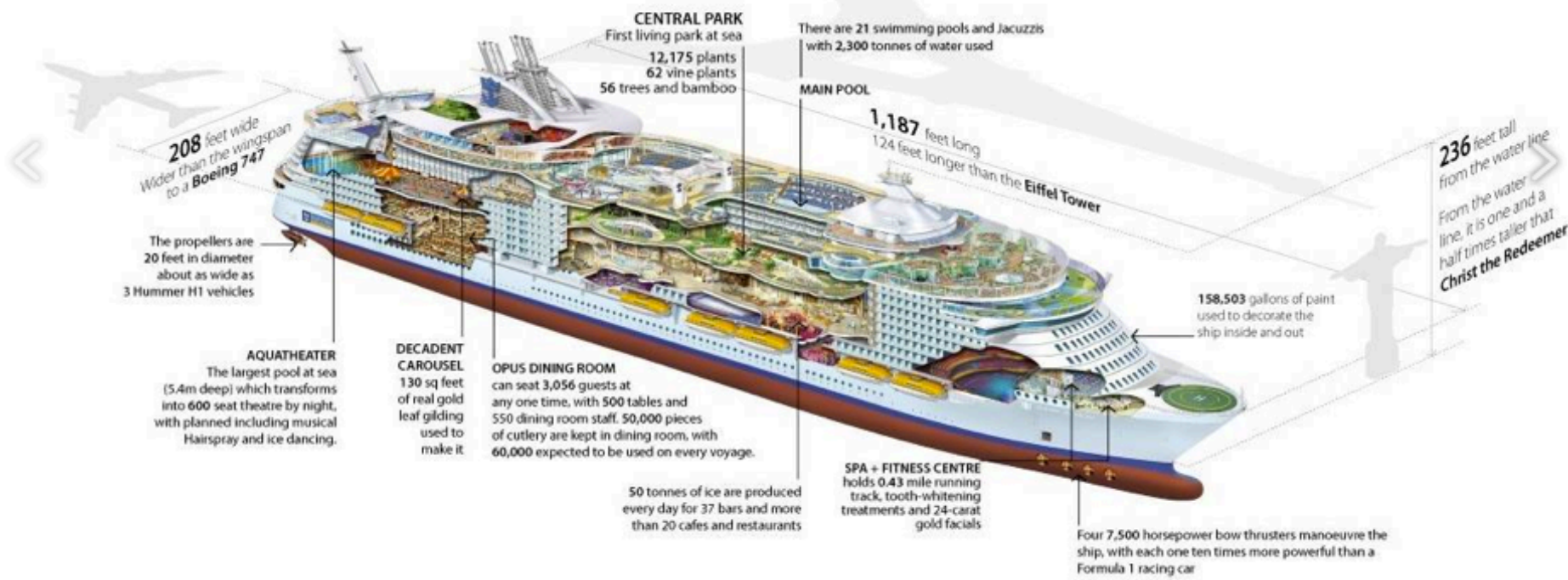
Costing \$1.4bn to build as much as Wembley stadium

with the combined effort of 3,200 shipyard workers to build the ship on schedule in 3 years equal to 8,000 man years of labour

Can accommodate 6,296 guests with 2,165 crew

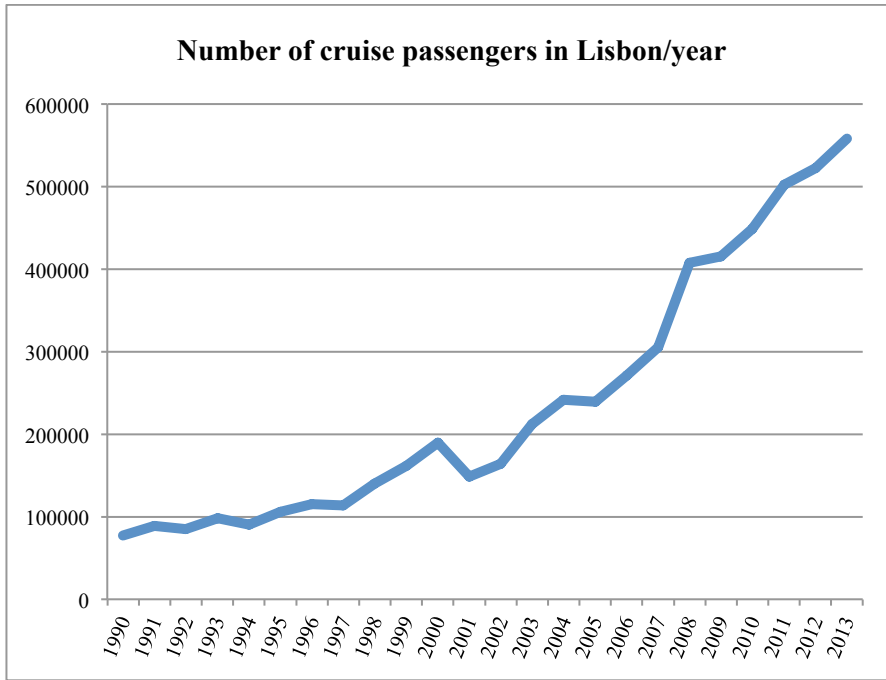
