Amanda Francis

is preoccupied with space/place and its role in the process of individuation. "Roadside 2019" is part of a series of moving image vignettes, observing and capturing common occurrences and incidents in and around her neighbourhood. Lisa Herfeldt

builds objects in various techniques and materials that, when assembled into installations, refer to the peculiarities of the space. Tongue-like forms spring from acrylic glass boxes, exploring, blocking and occupying the exhibition space. Her installations are often accompanied by printed matter such as posters, booklets or artist's books that show collections of images related to the objects. lisaherfeldt.info

Paul Jones

is an observer, cartographer and artist. In his drawings, animations and sculptures he explores the nature of material and the possibilities of form. In doing so he considers themes such as "what if" or embraces the feeling of being an outsider. Imitating nature but also working in parallel with it he alters natural environments, things and situations, for example in solar plate etchings of large weather systems. He also carves objects from green and salvaged wood, sometimes evoking a history already stored within it into the artefact. popcornaut.blogspot.com

Katia Kelm

uses photographic processes for his series of pictures. He enlarges cut-outs taken from plastic bags and plastic packaging in such a way that not much remains of the advertising medium that served as a model. His interest lies in overcoming the material through formal appropriation; the first aspect is the idea of autonomous form and the intuitive search for composition.

His current works are compiled in a catalogue and carry the title "Plastic Memory".
