"noch"

The open and brilliant qualities of the <u>o</u> (as in hot) vowel are modified—a phonetic o infiltrates the tone, the lips rounding to a more focussed embouchure, as I sing "down into" the vowel, projecting it towards chest resonances.

There is a leaning on this note, instigated by the voiced " $\underline{\mathbf{n}}$ ".

"von Eise grauen"

"grey ice" is accompanied by a danger and fear, while still appreciating the beauty and nuance of the natural surroundings.

A glottal stop punctuates this imagery and the sharpness of the ice is reflected in a sudden steely brightness of the diphthong "au".

"grauen" is emphasised by a change of colour (in the live video, this is a mysterious, breathy, hushed tone, almost subito piano; whereas in the CD recording, a similar sense of danger and mystery is cultivated through a focussing and richness of tone, almost baritonal in timbre".
